TASKS

- Picking up and/or drop off event vehicles from various locations in Adelaide
- Check vehicles for damage and report accordingly on vehicle checklists
- Removal of event related items such as fuel cards, rubbish and number plates from vehicles prior to vehicles being handed back to suppliers

*Please note, some of the tasks require heavy lifting. If you feel a task is beyond your capability, please advise your supervisor before attempting that task. This role requires being on your feet for the duration of the shift.

DRIVER REQUIREMENTS

- Hold a current valid 'car' class driver's licence
- Be comfortable driving a van (preferred)
- Be available for the full day
- Preferably be able to drive both manual and automatic vehicle
- Assistance with removing event related items from vehicle prior to vehicle departure – such as fuel cards, rubbish, number plates etc.

LOCATION & TRANSPORT

The shifts will be located at the in various locations of Adelaide CBD. You will check in at the required location in accordance with your shift.

Please note, there are no provisions within the Tour Village for private vehicles to be parked.

Volunteers are required to make their own arrangements to and from each shift.

MEALS

Water will be available at all times; please ensure you bring a reusable water bottle to refill.

A light meal will be provided if the shift is over 5 hours in duration.

Volunteers are welcome to bring snacks if they feel they require something to eat during the shift.

UNIFORM

Official event polo (provided at volunteer briefing), neat and tidy black/denim pants or knee length shorts/skirt, closed toed comfortable footwear.

A hat and sunscreen will be provided should work be required to be undertaken outdoors.

Position specific uniform and equipment such as safety vest, simplex radio and tools will be provided onsite as required.
